Preventing senior homelessness requires fluid coordination of community services to help individuals facing homelessness secure housing and other social services. This is the key focus of the partnership between **Baker Senior Center Naples (BSCN)** and Collier Resource Center (CRC), utilizing the **Hunger and Homeless Coalition of Collier County for housing** coordination.



"One of the most difficult challenges in our area is homelessness," said Dr. Jaclynn Faffer, CEO, Baker Senior Center Naples. "It has been shocking to learn that a growing number of senior women are homeless. Many have faced a life-changing event, such as the death of a spouse or a growing financial gap, leaving them without a place to live and carrying a heavy emotional burden. With this critical grant from the Women's Foundation of Collier County, we created a program to address what is called situational homelessness. In our model, when we receive a referral—often a self-referral—we reduce anxiety and offer much-needed stability by being at their side every step of the way. We go with them to appointments to find and settle into the right home, help them access services and resources, and provide seamless care, including counseling. Our experienced and credentialed team members have already successfully housed several area senior women."

**Mentorship and Career Development: The Immokalee Foundation** 

The Middle School Girls Careers Pathways program introduces career choices to Immokalee's girls at this critical stage of their lives. The girls come from families with very limited options, making this program necessary for them to escape intergenerational poverty. This program empowers them to imagine a different future and make the right decisions to achieve it.





"Girls in Immokalee no longer need to wait until high school to begin exploring careers," said Noemi Perez, CEO, The Immokalee Foundation. "This grant gave us resources to start an after-school program to expose 6th, 7th and 8th grade girls to career panels and field trips to local businesses, colleges and technical schools. As an example of impact, a female leader at the Collier County Sheriff's Office shared her path to law enforcement, leading to an increased interest in criminal justice careers. The generous Women's Foundation of Collier County grant also led to a new partnership with Microsoft and FGCU to add a 4-week digital and IT class. Girls can see how IT impacts every profession and industry, including construction management where opportunities are available for females. They can see options. They say, 'I can see myself doing that.'" members have already successfully housed several area senior women."
